Dear parent/carer

Now that your child is in Year 11 and there are only 17 weeks until their final exams, we wanted to inform you of the help and support that is on offer for you and your child over the next two terms.

Beginning this week, we will be holding intervention sessions for individual students who will benefit from additional support in specific subjects. Your child is being informed of the sessions that they have been invited to and an email of the timetable will be shared with you by the end of this week. These sessions will be during tutor time, lunchtime and after school. Please support us by encouraging your child to attend all of the sessions offered to them as this will greatly assist them in achieving their best grades in their final exams. If your child is asked to stay this week, you will receive a text message from us in the morning to let you know.

We will also be holding revision sessions during the February half term and the Easter holidays. Further information about these sessions will be sent out nearer the time. Afterschool revision sessions continue to run and a full list of what is available can be found <a href="here">here</a>.

The next set of Trial Exams begin 10 March. It is crucial that students attend every exam and maximise their opportunities to experience exam conditions. The results of these exams will be given to students Thursday 3 April and the same evening we will be holding our second Year 11 Parents' Evening.

Student attendance in school during all years is extremely important. During Year 11 it becomes vital. During this crucial year in their education, every lesson missed has a direct impact on gaps in student knowledge. Please support us with your child's attendance in school and if you have any issues with this, please speak to Mrs McDowall, Head of Year 11.

The Prom is part of the college's rewards program, celebrating the end of the student's secondary education and rewarding students for all their hard work leading up to and including the GCSE exams. This year the prom will be held on Thursday 26 June at Northwood House.

To encourage students to attend intervention sessions, ensure good attendance in school and conform to our behaviour policy, we are offering a new reward scheme where students can achieve points which will be turned into money off the ticket price for the prom - in essence, the more points earned, the cheaper the ticket for the prom. Or students can earn money off the hoodie or yearbook, or even be awarded Amazon vouchers if none of the others are applicable. When students achieve the required total they will get money off the cost and also be put into a draw to have the whole cost reimbursed. We will launch this scheme with the students in the next couple of weeks. In the meantime, please discuss this with your child to support us in achieving excellent attendance at school and all intervention sessions on offer.

There is no automatic right to attend the prom. If your child has an unacceptable level of behaviour points between now and the date of the prom, they will not be invited to attend.

We continue to be vigilant and supportive in relation to the health and wellbeing of students. We are mindful of the fact that this time in their school life can be quite stressful and some students may become anxious. We have a team of staff in school to support your child through this time and if you have any concerns or issues, please contact the Head of Year, Mrs McDowall in the first instance.
