What is Key Stage 4

- A two-year period (Years 10 and 11) of secondary education.
- Students study their GCSEs or equivalent qualifications and will take their final exams in Summer 2027.
- Core Subjects to be studied include:
 - English Language
 - English Literature
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - Physical Education
 - PSHE (part of our tutor programme)

 Students select four option subjects. Each subject will be taught over five periods per fortnight.

Types of Qualifications

- **GCSEs**: Mixture of coursework and exams, with the exam at the end of the course being worth a greater percentage of the final grade. Graded 1-9. Some subjects do not have coursework.
- Vocational Qualifications: Mixture of coursework and exams with the coursework worth a greater percentage of the final grade. Graded Pass L1, Merit L1, Distinction L1, Pass L2, Merit L2 and Distinction L2.
- Progression and Post-16 Options: Choices made in KS4 can affect options for further education, including A-levels, vocational qualifications, apprenticeships, and work-based learning.


English Baccalaureate

Guidance

Students have already had:

- Conversations with teachers and tutors
- Assemblies highlighting options available to gain more information about them led by subject specialists

Students now need to:

- Visit every area tonight
- Read the options booklet carefully
- Discuss with parents/carers
- Speak to your teachers
- Engage in careers related assemblies

Subject Viability

- We will make every effort to meet students first choices.
- On rare occasions, subjects do not recruit a viable group (number of students)
- Subjects such as Triple Science will only be accessible for those students who are appropriate, based on academic profile and engagement so far. If minimum of level 6 is not being achieved then this will prevent you from accessing the course.
- If a student is not suitable for an option, will be with honest:
 - o Don't select Food Technology if you have not brought ingredients for the last three years.
 - Don't select PE if your kit has been in the back of the wardrobe for the last three years.
 - Don't select Triple Science if you don't like all disciplines (Physics, Biology and Chemistry).
